4. Action Taken	Key findings were reported in the following manner:
	I have examined facts of the case in light of the applicable provisions of the law and have given due consideration to the written and verbal submissions and arguments of the Company. I am of the considered view that the Company has failed to comply with the mandatory requirements of rule 6 of the Rules despite expiry of ample time beyond the due date i.e. April 30, 2020, for which the Company is liable to be penalized under Section 156 of the Ordinance, in accordance with rule 8 of the Rules. The provisions of rule 8 of the Rules and Section 156 of the Ordinance are reproduced as under:
	Rule 8 of the Rules: "Any contravention with the requirement of these rules shall be punishable in accordance with the provisions of the Ordinance."
	Section 156 of the Ordinance: "Except as otherwise provided in this Ordinance, any insurer who makes default in complying with or acts in contravention of any requirement of this Ordinance, or any direction made by the Commission, the Commission shall have the power to impose fine on the insurer, and, where the insurer is a company, any director, or other officer of the

	company, who is knowingly a party to the default, shall be punishable	
	with fine which may extend to one million rupees and, in the case of a	
	continuing default, with an additional fine which may extend to ten	
	thousand rupees for every day during which the default continues."	
	In exercise of the powers conferred on me under Section 156 of the	
	Ordinance, I hereby, impose a fine of Rs. 50,000/- (Rupees Fifty	
	Thousand Only) on the Company on account of conceded and	
	established default of rule 6 of the Rules, as mentioned in th	
	above paras. The Company is hereby directed to ensure filing of	
	the GCS Form for FY 2019 to the Offsite Department-I,	
	Supervision Division, SECP within 20 days of the date of this	
	Order. The Company is warned that in case of similar default/non-	
	compliance in future, strict action will be taken against it.
