## Presentation on Corporate Governance held at SECP

**Islamabad** – **August 1, 2006**: In order to develop its institutional capacity, the Securities and Exchange Commission of Pakistan (SEC) often holds guest lectures be delivered by experts renowned in their respective fields. In this connection, a presentation on improving standards of corporate governance was held at the SECP head office in Islamabad on Tuesday.
